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Illustrator 3 Is Next Step In Interchange Experiment

Adobe Systems, fresh from a year that saw its Type 1 font technology adopted across a variety of platforms, now wants Postscript to bridge the gaps between myriad document formats across operating systems.

After first talking about Adobe Illustrator 3 (AI 3) last October, Adobe chairman and CEO John Warnock indicated that this interchange format proposal is tied to future versions of Illustrator. "AI 3 is the next step in an experiment to come up with a format that allows editing of text and graphics," Warnock said.

AI 3, or editable Postscript, is an interchange proposal that governs a document's content, so users can edit text and graphics. Other proposals, such as the recently derived Page Interchange Language, places emphasis on page geometry. Under such a system, a document's layout is preserved across operating systems, although the contents are not editable.

AI 3's advantage is that Postscript overrides the operating system's graphics model. On the Macintosh, for example, Illustrator invokes Postscript on top of the native Quickdraw model. A future version of Illustrator for Windows will not use Microsoft Corp.'s native GDI graphics model, but will "obey all the rules" for Windows compatibility, Warnock said. Because in both cases Postscript becomes the prevailing graphics engine, exchanging documents across platforms is transparent to the user, he said.

Although this is Adobe's vision for interchange, other vendors may have some reservations. Microsoft had chided Aldus for closing its Type 1 font format. But Adobe offers AI 3 as a published standard. "Revenues are not tied to the adoption of standards," Warnock said.
