Situation



- We do have:
 - PDF [1.7] (ISO 32000-1)
 - Tagged PDF [chapter 14.8]
- Tagged PDF can be used for multiple purposes, e.g.:
 - Accessibility
 - Content reuse
- No precise description how an accessible PDF should look like

Situation



- Solution: PDF substandard PDF/UA-1 (ISO 14289-1)
[UA = Universal Accessibility]
- Definition how to use 32000-1 for accessible PDFs
- Core clause 7.1, paragraph 2:
“Content shall be marked in the structure tree with semantically appropriate tags in a logical reading order”

Why PDF/UA is not enough



- PDF/UA based on PDF
- PDF standard itself and PDF/UA:
 - Do not cover all needs / issues
 - Both are not precise in all areas
- Example, description of Tag <Sect> (Section):
“A container for grouping related content elements.”
(PDF 32000-1, Table 333)

Matterhorn Protocol



- Testing reference / checklist
- 31 checkpoints, 136 failure conditions
- Divided into M (Machine) / H (Human); Examples:
 - Failure conditions 06-001 / 06-004
 - Failure condition 13-008

Tagged PDF Best Practice Guide



- Intended to help understand the syntactical characteristics of tagged PDF files – compressed into one document
- Detailed explanation of tagging syntax; Examples:
 - Empty tags
 - Footnotes
- And Attributes and properties; Example:
 - ActualText

Real word examples

Future development



- PDF/UA-2 (14289-2)
 - Based on PDF 2.0
 - E.g. new tags
 - Issues addressed (e.g. <Caption>)
- Still work in progress strongly forced by the PDF/UA TWG (association with ISO TC 171 SC 2 WG 9)
